But some people pike out and call us 'Western Desert Dialysis' or 'the purple house'. Some even call us 'Wooden Whippet'...It's a long story, we'll explain when you meet us! We don't care what you call us...just call us!

DIALYSIS IS THE EASY PART OF THE JOB!

Would you enjoy challenges of living remote, cultural immersion, problem-solving, meeting and making new friends, continually learning – creating the memories of a lifetime?

Do you want a change in where the 'work' aspect is way overshadowed for once by the "fun and interest" aspect? Real Australia only starts once you head west. (Even Uluru is in our catchment area). There are no hospital corridors-only red dusty roads. And no hospital night shifts. Only nights filled with a clear sky of a million stars. The kids are just gorgeous, the air is so clear, the landscapes so coloured. And the people here are as interested in you as you are in them (maybe even more so).

Do you want to work with an organisation that is directed by the people it services? An organisation that keeps the focus on what the core business is and doesn't get caught up in other agendas? Our philosophy at WDNWPT is return to country. Basically to work with WDNWPT you have


